Recognition of prior learning

Even if you have never formally studied or trained in a particular area, you may have gained knowledge and skills through:

Through RPL you could avoid duplication of training in areas you are already competent. It could be used to identify what training you may need to complete the qualification.

Delivery options

Daisy Learning will work with you or your organisation to meet your learning and development goals, by providing tailored, flexible solutions and support.

The course is developed for those who are employed in a direct support role in residential or community settings.

Delivery is blended learning, comprised of online and classroom workshops. The time to complete the course is between 6 to 18 months.

Completion time can vary depending on various factors including the individual learner and whether or not RPL or credits apply.

Work placement

Students completing this qualification are required to complete a minimum of 120 hours in the workplace. Because of the delivery type of this qualification, Daisy Learning recommend that students are already working, or volunteering in the industry and will be supported by their organisation to complete their workplace requirements.
