## ☀️ Entry requirements

- Must be Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Successful completion year 12 or equivalent Or acceptable English language, literacy and numeracy skills
- Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Be working in a direct support role in a residential or community setting
- Access to a computer, the Internet and basic computer proficiency

## ☀️ Qualification description

This qualification reflects the role of support workers who complete specialised tasks and functions in aged services, either in residential or home and community based environments. Workers will take responsibility for their own outputs within defined organisation guidelines and maintain quality service delivery through the development, facilitation and review of individualised service planning and delivery. Workers may be required to demonstrate leadership and have limited responsibility for the organisation and the quantity and quality of outputs of others within limited parameters.

## ☀️ Pathways to further study

This course covers units from the national training package, so participants may receive recognition towards other qualifications including, Certificate IV in Disability, Certificate IV in Leisure and Health or Diploma of Nursing.

## Delivery options
