## ☀️ Entry requirements

- Must be Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Successful completion year 12 or equivalent Or acceptable English language, literacy and numeracy skills
- Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- Preferable to be working in the community services industry.
- Access to a computer, the Internet and basic computer proficiency

## ☀️ Qualification description

This qualification reflects the role of workers participating in the design, implementation and evaluation of leisure and health activities and programs for clients in one or more sector areas. Workers may be in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres, completing specialised tasks and functions in relation to leisure and health. While workers are responsible for their own outputs, work is carried out under direct or indirect supervision within defined organisation guidelines.

## ☀️ Pathways to further study

This course covers units from the national training package, so participants may receive recognition towards other qualifications including, Certificate IV in Disability, Certificate IV in Ageing Support or Diploma of Leisure and Health (Diversional Therapy)

## Delivery options
